
### CONSERVATION SUCCESS STORIES

### FULTON COUNTY SWCD

The Fulton County Soil and Water Conservation District received a grant from the National Association of Conservation Districts to convert underutilized power easements into urban farms within the City of Atlanta in collaboration with City of Atlanta Mayor's Office of Resilience, Groundwork Atlanta, Food Well Alliance, USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service, and the Georgia Power Company.

Towaliga & Lamar County SWCDs teamed up with Two River RC&D to host a cattle field day for local producers.






### WALTON COUNTY **SWCD**

### BRIER CREEK SWCD

The Brier Creek SWCD has taken a proactive approach to feral hog eradication by working with landowners on a demonstration project, pursuing State and Federal funding, and developing a comprehensive wild pig action plan. Feral hogs are a major problem for agriculture and natural resources throughout Georgia - conservation districts have an opportunity to lead on this issue.
