LOWER CHATTAHOOCHEE RIVER Year in Review

We would like to share with you what the Lower Chattahoochee River Conservation District has been doing during the past year and what impacts we have made with our partners at

USDA's Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) Golden Triangle RC&D and Georgia Soil and Water Commission.

Our District and Golden Triangle RC&D had partnered last year with Randolph and Terrell Counties on a Better Back Road project. This year we are also working with the Golden Triangle RC&D on another project as it relates to the Better Back Road this time with Steward County. This is the Grassy Creek Roads project to repair two sites with damaged/crushed culvert pipes.

2022 Terrell County Cover Crop Field Day, we have been excited to join with UGA Extension, The Golden Triangle, and NRCS Jimmy Carter Plant Material Center in partnership with Bellflower Farms to participate in a 70-acre cover crop demonstration with 4 field length plots featuring Ry, Crimson Clover, Vetch and Triticale in various configurations.

This is the second year we have join with UGA Extension, The Golden Triangle and NRCS in this field day and it has been a huge success. There were over 25 local farmers/producers in attendance.

Our District has promoted GACD with the second phase of the Pollinator Initiative by partnering Terrell County High School.

Georgia Soil and Water Commission in partnership with the Lower Chattahoochee River SWCD, have worked with farmers in the Chickasawhatchee Watershed and has helped fund a Best Management Project in Terrell County.

This cost share project was for multi species cover crops in the fall of 2021, 326 acres were planted. The total value in those cover crops was \$27,159.00 in cost share within the Chickasawhatchee Watershed.

This partnership between Georgia Soil and Water Commission has produced a total value of \$34,830.00, for the last two years.

Annually the National Association of Conservation District has a NACD 2021 Poster Contest.

This poster contest is open to all public, private and homeschool students in grades K-12. The Lower Chattahoochee River SWCD select the top three posters that are submitted, then send them on to the State competition, if they place in the State competition, they will be eligible to move up to NACD's National Poster Contest.

Natural Resources Conservation Workshop is another program that the District supports by sponsoring students within our district to take advantage of this 5-day Workshop. Students take part in lectures and hands-on activities to boost their knowledge of Georgia's vital natural resources. It also provides them with a taste of college life while delivering valuable insight into careers in agriculture and natural resources through their counselors and instructors. This year the Lower Chattahoochee River Conservation District is happy that they were able to sponsor one motivative student from Terrell County to attend this year's workshop.


Judy has served as the face of our District for the last five years networking and serving as liaison with our local school systems to develop and execute stewardship programs, and other District initiatives involving local students.




